

With Read, Write Inc we are using pure sounds, ('m' not 'muh', 's' not 'suh', etc.) so that your child will be able to blend the sounds into words more easily. Have fun learning them!

These first sounds should all be stretched slightly. Try to avoid saying uh after each one:

		L for leg Keep pointed curled tongue behind teeth	Down the long leg

V		V for vulture Keep teeth on bottom lip and force air out gently	Down and wing, up a wing
Z		Z for zip Keep teeth together and make a buzzing sound	Zig-zag-zip down the zip
th		Phrase: Thank you Stick tongue out and breathe out sharply	Down the tower, across the tower, then down the horse's head to the hooves and over his back
sh	Sh	Phrase: Shhh said the horse to the hissing snake Shh noise as in 'be quiet!'	Slide down the snake, then down the horse's head to the hooves and over his back
ng		Phrase: A thing on a string Curl your tongue at the back of your throat	n = Down Nobby, up, over his net g = Round the girl's face, down her hair and give her a curl
nk	I think I stink	Phrase: I think I stink 'nk' as in 'oink'	n = Down Nobby, up, over his net k = Down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg



These next sounds cannot be stretched. We say that they are 'bouncy' sounds. Make the sound as short as possible avoiding uh at the end of the sound:

p		P for pirate Make a distinctive p with lips, unvoiced	Down the plait, up and over the pirates face
k	K	K for kangaroo Make a sharp click at the back of throat	Down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg
С		C for caterpillar Make a sharp click at the back of throat	Curl around the caterpillar
h		H for horse Say h as you breathe sharply out	Down the horse's head to the hooves and over his back
X		X for exercise Say a sharp c and add s, unvoiced	Cross down the arm and leg and cross the other way

d		D for dinosaur Tap tongue behind teeth	Round the dinosaur's bottom, up his tall neck and down to his feet
9		G for girl Make soft sound in throat	Round the girl's face, down her hair and give her a curl
b		B for boot Make a short, strong b with lips	Down the heel, up and over the toe
j		J for jack in a box Push lips forward	Down his body, curl and dot
Y		Y for yak Keep edges of tongue against teeth	Down a horn, up a horn and under the yak's head
ch	Ch.	Phrase: The caterpillars hairs make the horse sneeze Make a short sneezing sound

qu		Qu for queen Keep lips pursed as you say cw, unvoiced	Round the queen's head, up to her crown, down her hair and curl

The short vowels should be kept short and sharp:
