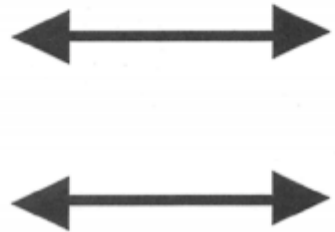

# COMPARING TWO CHARACTERS EXAMPLE

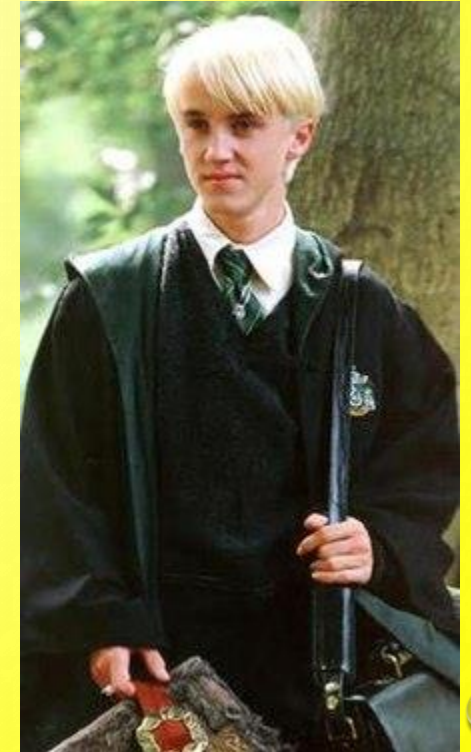

## Character differences-

Malfoy is in Slytherin whereas Ron is in Gryffindor.



# COMPARING TWO CHARACTERS EXAMPLE



Ron Weasley and Draco Malfoy attend the same school which is called Hogwarts. Both boys are characters in the Harry Potter books and they are both wizards. Ron has ginger hair whereas Malfoy has blonde hair. Also, Ron is in House Gryffindor and Malfoy is in House Slytherin. Malfoy's family hate 'muggles' but Ron's family love 'muggles'. Ron is very kind, funny and caring whereas Malfoy is a rude, nasty bully. Ron is Harry's best friend but Malfoy is his enemy.



# METAPHORS

A metaphor is a word or a phrase used to describe something as if it were something else.

Metaphors are another way to compare things but unlike similes they don't use 'like' or 'as'.

## Examples

'A wave of terror washed over him.'

'Her tears flowed like a river.'

'This classroom is like a zoo.'



# SIMILES

A simile compares two things in a sentence using the words 'like' and 'as'.

A simile is a useful way to describe something by creating a vivid image in the reader's mind.

## Examples

'The desert was as dry as a bone.'

'He runs as slow as a snail.'

'The siblings fight like cats and dogs.'

# ALLITERATION

Alliteration describes two or more words that start with the same letter or sound.

## Examples

'She sells sea shells.'

'Three grey geese.'

'That girl Betty burgled  
the school.'

# PERSONIFICATION

Personification is giving an inanimate object human feelings or actions.

Describing objects as if they are people is a way of making sentences more exciting.

## Example

'The thirsty flower seemed to reach out and beg for some water.'

'The leaves danced down from the tree's branches.'
